Acceptance Criteria

<u>Australian Open Playoff - Men's Event (24 positions available)</u>

- 1. All athletes ranked ATP 250 or better will be accepted*

 * Based on Monday 21st November 2011 rankings release
- 2. 18s Optus Australian Championships Winners
- 3. Remaining positions default to wildcards

<u>Australian Open Playoff - Women's Event (16 positions available)</u>

- 1. All athletes ranked WTA 250 or better will be accepted* * Based on Monday 21st November 2011 rankings release
- 2. 18s Optus Australian Championships Winners
- 3. Remaining positions default to wildcards

Initial acceptance lists will be available from 2.00pm Wednesday 23rd November 2011 and e-mailed to all entrants as well as being published on www.tennis.com.au

Behaviour

The Tournament will be played under the ITF Code of Conduct (match conditions) and in accordance with Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour. Tennis Australia may penalise or suspend players for breach of the Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour or Tennis Australia Member Protection By-Law. Please note that inappropriate behaviour at sites including, but not limited to,

the tennis venues (on and off court), hotels and transport vehicles, will be dealt with in accordance with these policies. These policies can be viewed at www.tennis.com.au. Tennis Australia may also issue financial penalties to players competing in the Australian Open Playoff, if warranted.

Specific Information relating to the Women's Event of the Australian Open Playoff

- 16-player Round Robin Draw
- Each player to play the three athletes within their pool
- Best athletes from each pool (4 total) to move into the semi finals. Note: All athletes are guaranteed three singles matches, played over the first three days of the competition.

The following procedure will be followed to place the sixteen (16) athletes into the four round-robin groups.

- 1. The field shall be divided into four (4) groups of four (4) players each. The top-seeded player shall be placed in Group "A", the second-seeded player shall be placed in Group "B", the third-seeded player shall be placed in Group "C" and the fourth-seeded player shall be placed in Group "D".
- 2. Athletes seeded 5 & 6 shall be drawn into either Group "C" or "D". Athletes seeded 7 & 8 shall be drawn into either Group "A" or "B".
- 3. The remaining eight (8) athletes shall be drawn by lot the first and second athletes drawn to go to Group "A", the third and fourth athletes drawn to go to Group "B" and so on.

The final standings of each group shall be determined by the first of the following methods that apply:

- (a) Greatest number of wins;
- (b) Greatest number of matches played;
- (c) Head-to-head results if only two (2) players are tied, or if three (3) athletes are tied, then:
 - i) If three (3) athletes each have one win, an athlete that has played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the athlete advancing to the Single Elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two (2) players tied with 1-2 records; then
 - ii) Highest percentage of sets won (sets won against sets played); then
 - iii) Highest percentage of games won (games won against games played).
 - iv) If (i), (ii) or (iii) produce one superior athlete (first place), or one inferior athlete (third place), and the two remaining athletes are tied, the tie between those two athletes shall be broken by head-to-head record.

- (d) If ties still exist after the above procedures, the Tournament Committee shall make the final determination.
- (e) In applying the tie-breaking procedures, a conduct default or retirement shall count as a win or loss. However, games won or lost in matches with the defaulting or retiring athlete shall not be counted in the application of subsection c. (iii) above.

After the round-robin group phase has been completed, the following procedure will be followed to place the four (4) eligible athletes into the knockout draw.

- (a) The winner of Group "A" will be placed on Line 1
- (b) The winner of Group "B" will be placed on Line 4
- (c) The winners of Group "C" and "Group "D" will be randomly placed on either Line 2 or Line 3.
- There shall be no playoff for 5th 16th place.

Alternate Sign-In

Men's Event

Alternates will be chosen by the Wildcard Selectors. Alternates must sign-in at least 30 minutes prior to the relevant first scheduled match on Tuesday 6th December 2011. Alternates must sign-in to be eligible for the daily per diem.

Women's Event

Alternates will be chosen by the Wildcard Selectors. Alternates must sign-in at least 30minutes prior to the first scheduled match each day of the Round Robin competition. Alternates must sign-in to be eligible for the daily per diem.

Match Formats

All matches will be the Best of three (3) tie-break sets, with the following exceptions – **Men's Final:** Best of five (5) sets, first four tie-break sets, fifth set advantage **Women's Final:** Best of three (3) sets, first two tie-break sets, third set advantage

Car Parking / Public Transport

Melbourne Park will be a <u>public transport venue only</u> during the December Showdown. Limited parking will be available for AO Playoff competing athletes. Please inform tournament staff if you will be driving to Melbourne Park during the tournament. Melbourne Park will be extremely busy during November and December due to numerous events and the bump-in operations for the Australian Open 2012. The number of car parking spots has reduced in 2011 due to the ongoing redevelopment works.

The best drop-off and pick-up point is outside Hisense Arena on Olympic Boulevard. We are encouraging all players, coaches and parents to utilise the public transport services available. Public transport details are listed below:

Tram

The No. 70 tram (Waterfront City Docklands – Wattle Park) stops outside the City Entrance of Melbourne Park. Go to http://www.metlinkmelbourne.com.au to view the timetable.

Train

Education Sessions

To complement the on-court match-play, the December Showdown will be offering off-court tennis specific information sessions aimed at players, parents and coaches.

The presentations will be scattered from November 28 – 16. Areas that will be covered include:

- 1. Anti-Doping
- 2. Social Networking
- 3. Nutrition
- 4. Racial Vilification
- 5. Having Respect for Others (i.e. Staff / Officials / Parents)
- 6. The dangers of Illicit Drugs
- 7. The dangers of Alcohol
- 8. Topic of choice from selected NA Managers or NA Coaches

Minor presentations will include:

- 1. International Tours Information
- 2. Explaining the NA Criteria
- 3. Explaining the AIS Pro Tour Program
- 4. Sport Science & Performance Analysis (AMS) information session
- 5. Parent Education Session
- 6. Q & A sessions lead by past players & high-profile coaches or staff
- 7. Career Opportunities outside of playing
- 8. Practical session focusing on core stability

Exact dates and details of presenters will be e-mailed to all entrants closer to December. Some of these sessions will be made compulsory for all competing athletes to attend.

Entering Online (http://tournaments.tennis.com.au)

The online entry system will require the full main draw entry fee upfront. Tennis Australia will forward any refunds required after the completion of all tournaments.

Entry fees are payable by VISA or MasterCard only at the time of entering. Athletes who do not make the final draw will receive a refund after the completion of the tournament (minus an admin fee of \$6.00). Players who withdraw from the event before the withdrawal deadline will also be entitled to a refund (minus an admin fee of \$6.00). Athletes withdrawing after the deadline will also receive a refund providing a valid medical certificate is received at Tennis Aust within 7 days of the event's completion.

<u>Step 1</u> – Go to http://www.tennis.com.au/tournaments Once you are at this page, look in the online calendar for the Australian Open 2012 Playoff and click the link to be taken to the tournament page.

Step 2 – Once you are at the tournament home page, click the "click here to enter online".

Step 3 – There will now be six steps in the entry process. The first step is to register for an account.

Step 4 – If you have an existing account, type in your login name and password (move to Step 7 if you have already registered for an account previously). If you don't have an account, click the "sign up" button. This will make online entry quicker in the future with all fields prepopulated when you login next time.

<u>Step 5</u> – Choose your own login name and password (use the check availability button to see if your login name is available). Enter all your details carefully and when completed, click the "I accept" button to continue.

<u>Step 6</u> – You should receive an instantaneous e-mail from Tournament Planner asking you to activate your account. If you do not click this link within 24 hours of receiving the e-mail, your account will be removed.

Step 7 – Now that you are registered for an account, type in your login name and password and click the "login" button.

Step 8 – Click the link to enter with your current account.

Step 9 – Read the regulations for the tournament and click the "tick box" at the bottom of the screen to agree to the entry conditions and continue to the next step.

<u>Step 10</u> – Complete further entry details for the event. To have these fields automated for next time, click the tick box to update your profile with this information. Once you have completed all fields, click the "continue" button.

Step 11 – Upon successful completion of the entry form, click the "submit" button.

Step 12 – Once this has been completed, you should receive a confirmation e-mail from Tournament Planner that the entry has been processed successfully.

As a condition of entry into the December Showdown 2010, players agree to cooperate with the media and to participate upon request by Tennis Australia, in tournament promotional activities including, but not limited to:

- participating in the commentary box for the Australian Open Playoff live streaming broadcast
- assisting with the Hot Shots tennis clinics and other activities associated with the hosting of school groups during the event.

Practice Courts

All athletes entered into the tournament will have limited access to practice courts at Melbourne Park on the day prior to the event start date for practice at no cost. However, some players may have to practice at secondary venues (Albert Reserve or Scotch College) if demand is high. Bookings can be made through Tournament Control on the day prior to the tournament start date, not before.

The process for morning warm-up and practice courts during the tournament will be outlined at each tournament player meeting.
