Awards

The winners of the men's and women's Australian Open Playoff will each receive a main draw singles wildcard into Australian Open 2013.

Court Surface

All matches at the 2013 Australian Open Playoff will be played on Plexicushion

Draw Format

Both the men's and women's playoff events will be a knockout draw of 16 players.

Scoring Format

Men's Singles – Best of <u>Five</u> Sets (final set advantage) for all matches Women's Singles – Best of <u>Three</u> Sets (final set advantage) for all matches

Official Ball

The 2013 Wilson Australian Open Ball will be used for this event

Behaviour

The Tournament will be played under the ITF Code of Conduct (match conditions) and in accordance with Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour. Tennis Australia may penalise or suspend





players for breach of the Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour or Tennis Australia Member Protection Policy. Please note that inappropriate behaviour at sites including, but not limited to, the tennis venues (on and off court), hotels and transport vehicles, will be dealt with in accordance with these policies. These policies can be viewed at www.tennis.com.au. Tennis Australia may also issue financial penalties to players competing in the Australian Open Playoff, if warranted.

Invitations

Tennis Australia will invite athletes to the 2013 Australian Open Playoff. Invitations will be issued at Tennis Australia's discretion. In order to be eligible for an invitation the player must:

- not currently be suspended by Tennis Australia, a Member Association, the ITF, or another applicable tennis authority, or have any outstanding financial liability or otherwise to any of these organizations, or otherwise be ineligible under any applicable code, rule, regulation, policy or procedure;
- be in good standing and of good character and not likely embarrass or bring into ridicule or disrepute Tennis Australia, its Member Association, the applicable tournament and/or the sport of tennis;
- have complied with all applicable rules, regulations, policies or procedures detailed by Tennis Australia; and
- confirm that they are not prohibited or restricted from playing in the tournament as a result of any visa conditions imposed on them by the Australian Immigration Department, or other conditions imposed by the police, any other government authority or court of law.

When are invitations issued to players / Acceptance of Invitation

Athletes will receive an invitation by Monday 12th November. Athletes receiving an invitation must acknowledge and accept their invitation by Monday 19th November 2012 if they wish to participate.

Alternates

Alternates will be chosen by the Wildcard Selectors. Alternates must sign-in at least 30 minutes prior to the relevant first scheduled match on Monday 10th and Tuesday 11th December 2012. Alternates must sign-in to be eligible for the daily per diem.

Player Cafe

Lunch vouchers will be provided to Athletes on a daily basis while they are competing. Athletes will only be able to redeem their lunch vouchers at the Melbourne Park player cafe. A range of hot meals will be available each day, as well as a sandwich bar and a range of pre-packed sandwiches. Hot and cold drinks will also be available throughout the day.

Live Streaming

At least one match court of the Australian Open Playoff from December 10 – 16 will be broadcasted by live stream, with commentary. Athletes playing on a broadcast court are required to participate in any associated pre and post match interviews and on court formalities.

Media & Community Engagement Commitments

As a condition of entry into the Australian Open Playoff, players agree to cooperate with the media and to participate upon request by Tennis Australia, in tournament promotional activities including, but not limited to:

- pre-match and post-match interviews
- pre-event functions or events including pre-event press conferences
- press conferences and interviews at the presentation ceremonies as well as the champions photo shoot immediately following each final
- participating in the commentary box for the Australian Open Playoff live streaming broadcast
- assisting with the Hot Shots tennis clinics and other activities associated with the hosting of school groups during the event.

Use of Image

By participating in the tournament each athlete understands and agrees that while participating they may be photographed and/or filmed and that their image and/or voice may be broadcast by Tennis Australia or third parties, without any further notice or compensation.

Medical

A physiotherapist will be available for both the men and women participating at the Australian Open Playoff 2013. There will also be a massage therapist available to athletes.

Player Meeting (Compulsory)

In addition to the <u>compulsory</u> draw and player meeting for the Australian Open Playoff, additional workshops will be conducted as outlined below. All athletes accepted are required to attend these workshops on Sunday 9th December.

Workshop Day – Sunday 9th December 2012

This day will include portrait photos and video interviews with the Tennis Australia Communications Department. The official draw ceremony will be held at 12pm, followed by a compulsory anti-doping education workshop and then lunch. Final details regarding this workshop day will be communicated to invited players closer to the event.







Practice Courts

All athletes entered into the tournament will have limited access to practice courts at Melbourne Park on the day prior to the event start date for practice at no cost. However, some players may have to practice at secondary venues (Albert Reserve or Scotch College) if demand is high. Bookings can be made through Tournament Control on the day prior to the tournament start date, not before. The process for morning warm-up and practice courts during the tournament will be outlined at each tournament player meeting.

Accommodation Per Diem

Athletes will be eligible for an accommodation per diem of \$60.00 per day commencing on 8 December 2012 and ending when the athlete exits the tournament, provided the Athlete is staying in hotel accommodation.

Accommodation

Special rates have been negotiated at "Mantra on Jolimont" and "Bayview on the Park" for participants of the December Showdown and Australian Open Playoff. Bookings can be made direct with the properties and must <u>quote</u> the **December Showdown event** to qualify for the rates listed below.

The allocations listed will be held until **Friday 30th November 2012** following this date rooms will be available subject to availability. To avoid disappointment it is suggested that bookings are made before Friday 30th November. Note charges will apply for 'no shows' and for bookings cancelled with less than 24 hours notice.

Car Parking / Public Transport

Athletes and their support personnel are encouraged to use public transport to and from Melbourne Park during the December Showdown. Limited parking will be available for AO Playoff competing athletes. Please inform tournament staff if you will be driving to Melbourne Park during the tournament. Melbourne Park will be extremely busy during November and December due to numerous events and the bump-in operations for the Australian Open 2013.

The best drop-off and pick-up point is outside Hisense Arena on Olympic Boulevard. We are encouraging all players, coaches and parents to utilise the public transport services available. Public transport details are listed below:

Tram

The No. 70 tram (Waterfront City Docklands – Wattle Park) stops outside the City Entrance of Melbourne Park. Go to http://www.yarratrams.com.au to view the timetable.

Train

Richmond Train Station & Jolimont Train Stations are the closest train stations to Melbourne Park. Each station is a short 5-10 minute walk to Melbourne Park. Go to http://metrotrains.com.au to view the timetable.

Buying your myki card

(Recommended if you will be in Melbourne for the length of the December Showdown)
The card price for a full fare myki is \$6 and \$3 for a concession, seniors or child myki.

You can buy a myki:

- by calling 1800 800 007
- from a myki machine (full fare myki only) at all metropolitan train stations and selected accessible tram stops and bus interchanges*
- the ticket window at Premium Stations
- 7-Eleven stores*
- selected retailers* where you see the myki sign
- Public Transport Victoria Hub myki Centre
- Public Transport Victoria Hub at Swanston Street

Please note: Allow up to seven days for delivery of myki cards ordered either online or from calling 1800 800 007. If you are buying myki online or from 1800 800 007, but decide not to register it, you will still need to provide your postal details so the myki can be sent to you. Your details will then be deleted within 30 days of the myki being sent to you. Register your myki so your balance is protected in case your myki is lost or stolen
