About the Event

The National Indigenous Tennis Carnival is the pinnacle event of the Indigenous tennis pathway in Australia, celebrating First Nations cultures through tennis both on and off the court, held annually in Darwin on Larrakia Country.

The event is more than tennis, it brings together Indigenous kids from every state and territory across Australia to connect with each other through tennis, cultural activities, career and health workshops; ultimately getting to know each other and sharing stories about themselves and their own communities back home.

NITC - the National Indigenous Tennis Carnival is called **NITC** for short, so you will see **NITC** throughout this document.

HISTORY

The National Indigenous Tennis Carnival was created in collaboration between the Evonne Goolagong Foundation, Tennis Australia, and Tennis NT. It is delivered with the continued support from all state and territory Tennis Member Associations around Australia.

Evonne Goolagong Cawley

We are honoured that Indigenous tennis legend Evonne Goolagong Cawley will be here at the event as always, to inspire and support players.

About Evonne Goolagong Cawley

Evonne Goolagong Cawley is from Wiradjuri Country.

In her glorious tennis career Evonne was ranked the number one player in the world in 1971 and 1976.

In total she won 92 pro tournaments, was a finalist in 18 Grand Slam singles events winning at Wimbledon twice, the Australian Open 4 times, the French Open once and was runner up 4 years in succession at the US Open.

She also won 7 Grand Slam doubles titles.

At her second Wimbledon triumph in 1980 Evonne became the first mother to win since Dorothy Lambert Chambers in 1914.

She represented Australia 7 times in the Fed Cup winning in 1971/73/74 and was Australia's Fed Cup Captain from 2002-04.

In August 2012, Evonne established and became the first Chair of the **Evonne Goolagong Foundation**. Since 2005, the Evonne Goolagong Foundation has awarded school scholarships, produced tennis coaches, sports administrators, university scholars and has helped with employment placement.

The National Indigenous Tennis Carnival was created in collaboration between the Evonne Goolagong Foundation, Tennis Australia, and Tennis NT.

Security

Our focus is on the kids, so this is a CLOSED EVENT. Spectators will not be admitted.

The event will have security at the gate.

All event staff will be easy to identify through their uniform and accreditation.

Approved event guests will be prescreened, checked on arrival by security, and provided with accreditation.





Getting Ready

THIS IS WHAT WILL BE PROVIDED BY THE EVENT

Supervision throughout the event (including during travel periods).

All food will be provided at the event. That includes breakfast, snacks, lunch, dinner and water.

All equipment including racquets, if a participant has their own racquet then they are welcome to bring it along.

Accommodation.

Travel to the event and daily transport to and from venue.

Participant gift-pack with drink bottle, small bag, a hat

Uniforms – participants and supervisors will receive **two team shirts** (in their state or territory colours). The event shirt must be worn throughout the event.

Getting Ready

WHAT PARTICIPANTS NEED TO BRING ON THE TRIP

Playing gear including:

Underwear (enough for the whole event)

Bathers / Swimwear

A towel for the pool

Sunglasses if you have them

Pyjamas

A bag to carry gear in

Hat (one will also be provided in the gift pack)

Water bottle (one will also be provided in the gift pack)

Toiletries:

- Toothpaste,
- toothbrush,
- soap,
- hairbrush,
- deodorant.
- sunscreen (there will also be plenty at the event)

Spending money is optional, not required

Photos: parents and legal guardians should have a conversation with their child's team supervisor if their child should not be identifiable in any photography. Kids who should not be identifiable in photography will be given a wristband, and photographers will take care to ensure their face is not visible in any published photos.

Swimming: parents and legal guardians must advise their team supervisor if their child cannot swim. We will provide a wristband to indicate this.



Getting Ready | Cultural Exchange

At the end of the first day of the event, we have an activity called the *Cultural Exchange*. This year the Cultural Exchange will be held at the end of Day 1, Thursday 8 August from 6:00 – 7:00pm.

Before teams arrive at the NITC, we invite you to think about what you would like to share about your team's cultural background. This can take any format you like, that your group is comfortable with. Some teams are very shy, of course it's OK for their team supervisor to share some information that their team would like everyone else to know.

The format is up to the teams. Groups might choose a representative, or maybe they all want to join in. Each group will take the lead for a few minutes, up to five minutes.

Teams are free to do what they are comfortable with. That might be speaking, singing, showing art, dancing. We understand some kids can be shy or be shame (don't be shame!).

We hope that all participants will be proud to share in what will be a culturally safe, inclusive, welcoming session!


The aim of the Cultural Exchange is to:

Foster a culturally safe experience for young First Nations participants to proudly showcase their cultural background in a way they've chosen in the spirit of self-determination.

Learn through cross-cultural experiential education from one another: everyone involved can learn about the different cultural aspects shared at the NITC with the whole player and staffing group. Facilitate a space for fun and pride in culture that is meaningful for the participants, focused on celebration and raising-up of respectful cultural differences in a supportive, joyful space. Learning together increases inclusivity, breaks down cultural barriers to understanding and creates life-long memories and friendships by bringing participants together.

Travel & Accommodation





Most teams will arrive on Wednesday 7th August, or very early on Thursday 8th August. Departures commence Sunday 11th August.

Teams have different arrangements depending on where they are travelling from. Your team manager will provide you your exact details.

Rest assured that all participants and their supervisors have their accommodation until Monday 12th August, this allows for them to rest on Sunday the 11th before departing for home.

Travel for Participants & Supervisors is fully coordinated, including:

- All airport pick up and drop off in Darwin
- To and from the accommodation daily
- To and from any off-site activities

Accommodation for all Participants and their Supervisors is at *Club Tropical Resort.* The hotel is close to the event, just a ten-minute drive away in an area away from the city.

Participants will be in shared rooms of the same gender and similar age.





Activities at the event (additional to tennis)

The NITC will turn into a cultural hub for participating players and locals hosting various artistic activities, ceremonies and performances that will take place alongside tennis programs.

This year, we welcome **J-MILLA** and a **Surprise Guest Artist** to perform private concerts for our participants on Friday and Saturday nights.

Cultural Activities are a Major Part of the event!

Participants will be invited to participate in a range of cultural activities at the carnival, this includes activities ranging from:

- Dance / Music
- Health Education
- Careers in Sport
- Arts / Craft Creation
- Performances by Indigenous Music Artists

Additionally, the participants will visit *Leanyer Water Park* once with their supervisors to cool off. The visit to Leanyer Water Park is the only activity not occurring at the Darwin International Tennis Centre. In the event schedule, it is indicated as an "off-site activity". Additional staff supervisors will be present at the water park.


