Fast 4 Tennis: The Rules

Play Lets. If the serve clips the tape and lands in the service box, there's no let, it's game on. What's more, when playing doubles either the receiver or their partner can take the return.

No Ad Scoring. As soon as a game gets to deuce it's "next point wins". The receiving pair decides who returns the point.

Tiebreaker at 3 Games All. At 3 games all a short tie-break is played, first to 5 points. If it gets to 4-4 its "next point wins" with players coming to the net to spin the racquet to decide who serves the final point to determine the set.

First to 4 Games Wins. Hence the name FAST4. It doesn't matter how you get there, just make sure you get to four before the competition does.

Scoring & Power Play. Scoring will be numerical (1, 2, 3, game) rather than 15, 30, 40. Each player has the ability to nominate a "Power Play" once per set when serving. They must hold up the ball and announce "Power Play". The winner of the Power Play point receives 2 points. *FAST4 Tennis* Leagues uses a new ball that helps for longer rallies and more enjoyable matches
